# ADB-JSP in DES/GSFS/UT

Two years' scholarship to pursue master or doctoral degree for those who have at least two years' professional working experience.

## • Eligibility

- A national of an ADB borrowing member
- A bachelor degree or its equivalent with superior academic record
- At least two years of full-time professional working experience
- Not more than 35 years old at the time of application
- Must live or work in his/her home country
- Should agree to return to his/her home country upon graduation

## • Scholarship Coverage

- Maximum two years of coverage for
- full time tuition fees
  - monthly stipend
  - allowance for books and instructional materials
  - allowance for medical insurance
  - round-trip airfare

## • Important Dates

- Application due: December 10 of the preceding year to which applicants want to enroll
- Notification of selection of DES/GSFS/UT: Early March
- Notification of selection of ADB-JSP: Early May
- Start of Enrolment: October 1

Note that application materials include documents which it may take time for you to prepare. Such documents include official or attested copies of degree certificate, transcripts, and two letters of recommendations. So, please start preparation well in advance.

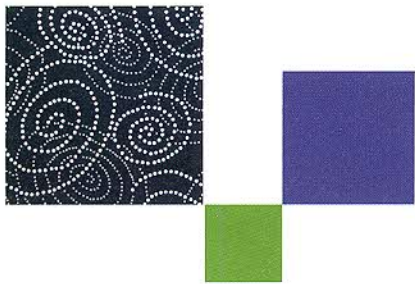

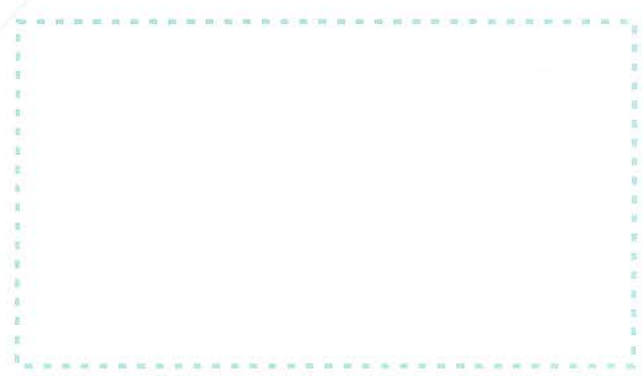
